PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I have to say that the start of this season has been one of the most difficult that I have encountered in my many years of cricket administration. And it was all mostly due to the weather.

Sure, we also had the new PlayHQ system coming online, replacing the previous MyCricket which we had grown to know well, even with its limitations and problems. But the impact the rain had on the start of our season created headaches, wreaking havoc on October and the Royal Hotel Cup competition. We also had grounds out of action early on as some were simply too wet to even get on to mow, let alone get a pitch prepared, with 3 out of the first 4 Saturdays abandoned. Fortunately, after that rough start, the weather was kinder to us and we managed to get through the remainder of the season without too many issues.

Thank you to all of our sponsors for your support again during the season. In particular, I'd like to thank the Royal Hotel and Phocas, who have supported this Association over a number of years but have decided to not continue next season.

Cavaliers had a very successful season, winning their 18th Bonnor Cup title as well as the BOIDC 1st Grade competition. They also picked up their very first ever Second Grade title, as well as winning Centenary Cup. CYMS however took out the McCarthy Cup after they had finished as minor premiers in both our Second and Third Grade competitions as well as in BOIDC First Grade and finished second to Cavaliers in Centenary Cup.

Phoebe Litchfield made her debut for the Australian women's team in the WT20I series in India during December. Phoebe went on to make her WODI debut against Pakistan in January, where she made a couple of undefeated half centuries at the top of the order. I look forward to seeing plenty more of Phoebe on the international stage, and congratulate her on this fantastic achievement. I hope her success inspires more girls to take up our wonderful game.

We also had Phoebe back playing at Wade Park this season with the ground playing host to the NSW Breakers and ACT Meteors for 2 WNCL matches during February. Wade Park looked absolutely fantastic and we witnessed 2 absolute cracking games of cricket.

At the time of writing this report, there has been interest from a Sydney club about bringing a NSW Premier Cricket First Grade match to Wade Park next season. It's only early doors, but let's hope this can be made to work.

On a slightly more local front, Wade Park and Riawena played host to the southern pool of the NSW Country Championships in late November. There were some initial concerns about Riawena being ready due to the early season weather. As it turned out, the first match played on the ground for this season was at the Country Championships.

The new picked fence around Riawena, built at the end of last season, looks fantastic and was a much needed upgrade. I reckon a set of sight screens would just about be the finishing touch, so we'll see what we can do over the coming years to turn that into a reality. We are also looking at improvements to the building itself, as it is starting to look tired. Some new furniture, carpet, blinds and a fresh coat of paint on the inside will go along way to freshening the place up.

The Wade Park changerooms were also upgraded this season and we look forward to using these improved facilities next season.

Thank you to all of the volunteers in our game, helping to put teams on the park each week. Thank you also to the Committee for your work during the season.

Finally, congratulations to all of those players that have achieved higher representative honours this season.

NSW Breakers to play two WNCL games at Wade Park, Orange

Orange will this summer take another step towards hosting the jewel in Cricket Australia's domestic crown when it welcomes two Women's National Cricket League matches to town in February.

Cricket Australia confirmed an enhanced WNCL schedule this week, with each of the seven teams playing each other twice in the 2022-23 draw. That beefed up schedule allows two games to be brought to Orange, where we'll see the NSW Breakers take on the ACT Meteors on February 10 and February 12 at Wade Park. The WNCL is a 50-overs-a-side one day competition.

At that point in the summer there's no international women's games on the calendar, meaning Orange could play host to some of the best women's cricketers on the planet. Alyssa Healy, Rachel Haynes and Ash Gardner are in the Breakers squad alongside young-guns Hannah Darlington and Orange District Cricket Association graduate Phoebe Litchfield.

The Breakers other home games will be played at North Sydney Oval. "It is exciting to be taking the NSW Women's team to Orange," Cricket NSW's Chief of Cricket Performance, Greg Mail said. The trip to Orange for the final two games of the NSW Breakers' 2022-23 WNCL campaign is part of a wider regional strategy by Cricket NSW. The men - the NSW Blues - will also play in Wollongong.

"Regional NSW provides so much to Cricket in NSW and Australia in terms of talent development and it will be a fantastic opportunity to celebrate cricket in those centres and for young girls and boys in the region to see elite cricket up close," Mr Mail added.

Orange District Cricket Association president Mark Frecklington said Cricket NSW's decision to bring games to Western Zone heartland was a big thumbs up for the facility at Wade Park.

The ground has undergone major renovations in the last decade; the venue now boasts turf practice nets, sight screens at either end of the ground and a new, indoor centre of excellence, which was opened at the end of 2020.

Mr Frecklington said hosting the WNCL was a boon in its own right for Orange and didn't want to call February's looming twin fixtures a test case to see whether or not the ground was capable of staging first class men's cricket too.

But he believes the wheels are "absolutely" now in motion down that path. "That'd be great for Orange and this area (to have a Sheffield Shield game at Wade Park). To have something like that, I'd welcome domestic cricket in any form here," he said. "You're not going to get a lesser crowd coming out here (than you would in Sydney) but there would be deals with players to play shield games at SCG. Cricket NSW has been taking games to regional areas for years."

Undoubtedly the premier cricket ground in the Western Zone, Wade Park has been brought up to a level now where many players who play grade cricket in Sydney don't get to enjoy the same calibre of playing conditions, Mr Frecklington said.

The Western Zone chair and Central West Cricket Council boss too, Mr Frecklington added Wade Park was the ideal place for Cricket NSW to look at when considering bringing games to regional areas. "And as long as the playing surface remains good then we're in a good place," he added.

"I would imagine down the track we might get a Shield game or something of that ilk. I don't know about BBL, but possible WBBL. "But certainly, now Wade Park ... it'd have to be up there. The Coffs Harbours, Alburys, Waggas; they're all top class as well that have hosted Big Bash. We'd be the best in Western Zone and one of the better in Country NSW."

Lachlan Skelly named Orange Cricketer of the Year

Lachie Skelly came to Orange City with the reputation as a former under 15s Australian cricketer. Having had some time away from cricket, it wasn't a reputation Skelly particularly enjoyed as he looked to ease his way back into the game.

But now, with the 2022/23 season close to its end, the Orange City off-spinner will head into next season with the reputation as one of the best in the region after he was awarded Orange Cricketer of the Year.

The right-arm tweaker - who can spin the ball both ways - made his mark in the Bathurst Orange Inter District Cricket competition, with 29 wickets at 20.52. However, the biggest achievement for Skelly might be his ability to finally play a full season.

Growing up in Crookwell and playing cricket all across NSW and ACT, Skelly had yet to get through a full list of matches in his career due to shoulder and back injuries. "I've never had one, this is the first proper full season I've had," he said. "I always seem to make it to the last few games then get injured."

The secret? Having been through intense pathway systems as a junior, Skelly's putting it down to a simple approach to his cricket. "I don't really know ... when I was doing it all as a junior there was programs attached to that but this year it was just go at your own pace which was awesome, it was way more relaxed," he said.

Prior to the 2022/23 season, it had been three years since he last played, after finishing up at South Wagga Blues.

Arriving in Orange after the 2021/22 season, Skelly made his way to Orange City and made his mark, playing for BOIDC and Bonnor Cup for the side. He then went on to play for Orange in the Western Zone Premier League before achieving Western Zone selection in the Country Championships. The off spinner also starred for Central West Wranglers in the Regional Bash.

With representative and club form considered in the Cricketer of the Year criteria, Skelly was always a likely choice. For him, the accolades and representative squads weren't part of any pre-season goals.

"I think I surprised myself a little bit, I came in not really knowing what to expect after having a bit of time off with injuries but I'm just glad I could still hold a ball - I wasn't expecting anything like that," he said.

Having previously played for Wagga Wagga Sloggers in the Regional Bash, the competition wasn't foreign for Skelly. However, reaching the grand final wasn't a stage Wagga Wagga ever went close to and the off spinner thrived on the big occasion at North Sydney Oval, taking 2/22 in a losing side against Newcastle.

The standard of competition in the T20 format was one he enjoyed. "It was good, it was competitive against Western Plains Outlaws (in the opening match), I was a bit disappointed that South Coast and Illawarra pulled out," he said. "Once we got to North Sydney, the level was a really high standard which was good to see - it was challenging and fun, I enjoyed it."

Now Skelly has a lay of the land, his focus next season will be on success for Orange City. The Warriors had an interrupted season with a number of players used in the BOIDC season, and for them a seventh placed finish was below expectations. Skelly wants to make sure there's significant improvement for his side when the 2023/24 season rolls around.

"The ambition is to make finals and have a red hot crack," he said. "I think we had the team to get there to get a lot closer than we did this season, which was unfortunate, but it was a building season for us.

"Next season we'll be good to go, if we can make finals and get close to the big dance that would be unreal."

ROYAL HOTEL BONNOR CUP

The original plan was to hold an 8 team competition consisting of only BOIDC 1st Grade teams. An 8 team competitions fits into the available Friday nights, meaning we didn't need to play Sunday matches, which was proving unpopular with some clubs. Three Wednesday nights would also be used to help to fill the gap left by Wade Park not being available on a number of Fridays due to the WNCL matches and the Country Championships.

Centennials Bulls had already advised they wouldn't be entering a team as they wanted to focus their efforts on first grade. That meant 9 possible teams, and if all wanted to play, then a qualification phase would be used to get to the 8 teams.

The four semi finalists from last season would automatically qualify for the main competition, as would all Orange clubs. That left 3 teams competing for 2 available positions. These 3 teams would play each other, with the 2 highest placed teams from the qualifying round progressing to the main draw.

The qualification concept, whilst controversial, ended up being scrapped as wet weather wreaked havoc on the competition, washing out all 3 qualification matches. As the Committee was considering its options, Lithgow had started asking about the competition. These enquiries led to Lithgow being readmitted, although there was still some doubt as to whether they were 100% committed, the qualification phase scrapped with a new 10 team competition created. A 10 team competition allowed for 2 pools of 5, whereas a 9 team competition had had detractors in past seasons, when a variety of systems had been used to cater for the odd number.

The Lithgow idea ended up falling through. After forfeiting their first match, they were forced to withdraw shortly before their second scheduled match when they were unable to get a team together for that match. So ironically, we ended up with the original 9 teams, but in 2 pools.

The revised competition also meant Sunday matches needed to be reintroduced.



Clinical in the field, clinical with the ball and as always dominant at the top with the bat.

It's the Cavaliers identity and the club's extraordinary success in the Royal Hotel Bonnor Cup entered a new chapter with a 2022/23 championship victory against Rugby Union at Wade Park.

The win is redemption for the side after a nine-wicket loss to St Pat's in last year's edition and captain Bailey Ferguson was delighted to have returned silverware to his squad after losses in the T20 competition and BOIDC grand final last year.

"It's good, it gets the monkey off our backs," he said. "We lost both last year so it's always good to win this one and couldn't be with a better bunch of blokes."

After winning the toss and batting, Ferguson led the way with his opening partner Matt Corben, with the two smashing 85 runs in the first 10 overs to start the game brilliantly. Ferguson (30) and Corben (49) then fell in the same over to Yousuf Qureshi who put Cavaliers in a significant hole when they became 4/90 in the 13th over. Hugh Middleton (16) and Gus Cumming (13) offered some stability in the middle order to get Cavaliers to 7/132 from its 20 overs.

Qureshi finished the best of the bowlers with 2/13 off four overs.

Chasing a total under lights was always going to be difficult for Rugby Union, and it couldn't have got off to a worse start when Sam Macpherson was caught behind first ball off Kyle Buckley. Buckley then had his second victim with captain Ryan Peacock caught at slip for 2.

In the lead up to the game, Corben said the best fielding side would win the match, and despite his team dropping a catch earlier, they made up for it with a direct hit run out removing the dangerous Tanvir Singh for 29 with Rugby now 3/49 off eight overs.

From there it was all downhill with wickets consistently flowing, mainly through Wes Lummis who finished with 3/9 in a sensational effort as Rugby limped to 8/103, delivering Cavaliers the title once again.

Ferguson agreed the start from his side ultimately proved the difference. "The power-play is massive and if you can get through unscathed without any wickets, even one, and keep the scoreboard ticking over which me and Corbs have done all year (then you'll do well)," he said.

"We pride ourselves on our start and did exactly what we spoke out tonight so it was awesome."

Player of the match honours went to Corben for his efforts with the bat while the Carl Sharpe medalist for player of the series was Kyle Buckley.

Buckley's 3/20 throughout the match proved pivotal for his side, and his skipper believes he was more than deserving of the award. "He's been amazing with the new rock and taken the best sticks in every game so I couldn't fault him, he's been amazing," Ferguson said. "He's been probably our key this year, with the new rock he's taken it in his stride and did it again tonight."

Ferguson added the victory will provide his side with much needed momentum heading into the BOIDC finals, with one round left to play against Bathurst City Colts at Loco Oval.

"It's massive, I know we don't have George and Gus (Cumming) for the rest of the year but it's a group mentality," he said. "We have confidence going into the finals and it's a whole different ball game."

Considering the history Cavaliers have with the Royal Hotel Bonnor Cup, it was somewhat timely for the side to win as the competition says goodbye to a significant era. Sponsorship will no longer come from the Royal Hotel, ending a 19-year association.

Wade Park out of action after storm hits Orange

Wild weather over the past two days has seen finals cricket moved at the last minute. Orange was hit with two separate downpours on Wednesday and Thursday, with wind speeds of up to 90km/h recorded on the latter.

It was these winds, as well as the rain, which saw one of the sightscreens at Wade Park pushed to its breaking point. On Thursday afternoon, the sightscreen on the tennis court end nearly collapsed onto the field itself, with only the fence around the ground holding it up.



This caused concern for first grade cricketers, who were due to play a grand final qualifier at the ground on Saturday and Sunday. To make matters worse, during the storm, the covers which were protecting the pitch were blown off.

Initially, it was hoped that the sun would shine bright enough throughout Friday morning that the pitch would be able to be played on, and that the sightscreen could be moved back in time for the game. Neither of these would be the case and the first grade game between Orange CYMS and Rugby Union has had to be moved to Riawena Oval.

This has caused a snowball effect, as the second grade grand final was due to be played at Riawena on Saturday. As of Friday afternoon, the ODCA committee has decided the second grade match will be played at Bloomfield Oval, with third grade and Centenary Cup games moved to synthetic grounds, although it is still up in the air which fields will be ready to play on come the weekend.

In a message sent out to clubs on Friday afternoon, ODCA president Mark Frecklington said: "The storm that hit (Thursday) has created havoc with preparation of pitches for (Saturday) grand finals. Covers were blown off Wade Park and Brabham 4, so they are both out of action. "We will hopefully confirm synthetics (Friday afternoon) - we simply haven't had time to have a look at them yet to confirm if they are ok."

He also issued a reminder to home teams - those who finished higher on the ladder - that it was their responsibility to lay covers Friday afternoon.

A final decision on whether games will go ahead on Saturday at the grounds already noted, moved once again or games moved to Sunday, will be made on Saturday morning. "Both turf pitches will have further work done on them tomorrow morning and then the committee will inspect and make a decision from there," Frecklington's message added. "We do have the Sunday as a backup day. Teams need to be prepared in all grades to play on Sunday.

Thursday's rainfall was believed to have exceeded 50mm but an exact figure had yet to be published.



In the latest chapter of what has quickly become one of the best rivalries in town, Orange City prevailed in a thrilling grand final over CYMS on Saturday. Having been the best two teams in the Orange and District Cricket Association third grade competition all year, it was only fitting that the decider came down to the wire.

Having been bowled out for 112 and forced to watch CYMS opener Pinhalan Ratnakumar hit ball after ball to the boundary during a quick-fire 31, the Warriors needed someone to step up and stop the bleeding. "Just try and slow the runs down I suppose," Proudfoot said of what was running through his mind when he was thrown the ball. "We were pretty confident with our bowling attack. We knew CYMS' opening fellas and (Aquinder Dhillon) especially can put pressure back on us, but we knew where they liked to hit so we bowled to a plan and went with that."

CYMS went from 0-37 to 9-87 in what seemed like the blink of an eye. All-rounder Shehan Fernando (26) and number 11 Isaac Rodd (nine not out), nearly got CYMS over the line, but when Fernando chopped one on off the bowling of Andrew Rutledge, it was City's game to celebrate.

"It looked like a defendable total, but it wasn't a strong total. We were nervous and excited the whole time, but never overly confident," Proudfoot added. "Most of the games we've had with CYMS have been really good and really tight, so I actually thought we were a little bit short. But we bowled well and got a little lucky."

Proudfoot's effort with the ball would earn him player of the match honours and may just be enough to convince him to come back for another go-round next season. "It's a good bunch of blokes to be around. I love the comradery of the third grade comp. Everyone has a go, but it's always pretty good spirits," he said. "I'll see how the body holds up, but touch wood I'll be back."

Orange Cavaliers junior Tom Blowes earns U17s Country NSW squad honours

Batter, bowler or both? Tom Blowes' best attribute on a cricket field might still be up in the air, but what's not debatable is the talent he possesses.

The Cavaliers junior was recently selected in the under 17s NSW Country Academy squad after a stellar season which was capped off by a first grade grand final victory.

The soon-to-be 16-year-old bowled 14 overs and picked up the wicket of Luke Hunter during Cavs' 38-run win at Wade Park and said the experience he gained throughout the year was immeasurable.

"With those group of boys, I learnt so much from all of them, especially my bowling throughout the season," he said. "Then, watching people like (Matt Corben and Bailey Ferguson) bat, it's pretty amazing each week."

Between his club cricket and representative stints with sides such as Western and Sydney's Green Shield squad, Blowes amassed 754 runs (32.78 average) and 30 wickets (20.07) throughout his 2022/23 campaign.

"I'd like to think I'm an all-rounder, but I'm still seeing," the teenager added.



Blowes was one of only two Western players selected in the NSW Country team - along with Dubbo's Harry Roscarel.

Getting the nod was that much sweeter for Blowes, who came agonisingly close to cracking the squad the previous season. "Last year was a bit of a surprise. They announced the squad and I wasn't even in Western at the time, so I obviously didn't make the (Country) squad," he said.

"They then had a State Challenge and I got included in that and from there, they picked a team to go play nationals. Although I was in the State Challenge, I was one of the players who didn't get picked. It was still nice to be recognised last year but even better to make the squad this year."

Blowes was thankful that his recent representative experience had gained him some familiarity with the rest of the 21-player squad. "The thing about playing Green Shield and playing for Western is that I know a lot of the people I'm playing against and I'm good mates with them through cricket," he added. "Even some of the boys from Illawarra, I only know them through cricket so it's nice to build friendships outside the Western area."

Although this will be Blowes' last year of eligibility for the under 17s side, the youngster was glad to have done enough to get on the radar for future seasons.

"It's nice that now I know the selectors and they know me," he said. "It's good that I'm not a complete stranger to that type of stuff now."
