PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am going to start this year's report by thanking everyone that was involved in the delivery of our season. There is a lot of work that goes in from a lot of people to make our seasons happen and I personally thank all who are involved. A special mention must go to the Committee, to all of the club volunteers who put their teams on the park each and every week, to the umpires, both the official umpires and those who took on that role for their team where official umpires weren't available, particularly in the lower grades.

It was fantastic to see a NSW Premier Cricket match being played at Wade Park, when Manly and Western Suburbs played under lights on 16 December. It was even better to have local boy Lachie Coyte making his first grade debut in the match. In November, we again played host to the Country Championships, which this season included a extra day for the Plan B Country Bash, which weas replacing the previous Plan B Regional Bash. Unfortunately rain hampered all 3 days of the Country Championships, and all matches werren't able to get to a result.

We welcomed some new sponsors this season with BurMac Insurance Solutions, Games N More and Trussco coming on board. BurMac took over from the Royal Hotel as our Bonnor Cup sponsor. We also had McDonalds as our Association major sponsor, while Kookaburra and Parkview Hotel also continued with their financial support. We thank all of our sponsors for their support and look forward to continuing our arrangement with each for seasons to to come.

Spring Hill and Gladstone were both permitted to drop to third grade for this season, meaning that we would have 6 teams in third grade and 5 in seconds. Centrals were to later become the sixth team in second grade when they pulled out of first grade. Intitially we had 5 teams in Centenary Cup, but Cavaliers didn't have thre numbers so withdrew early leaving 4 teams to contest that grade. Following Centrals' withdrawal, we still had 3 Orange clubs; Cavaliers, CYMS and Orange City contesting the BOIDC First Grade competition.

CYMS took out the McCarthy Cup for the second consecutive year, as well as the third grade premiership. After finishing second behind Spring Hill in the regular season they were too strong for the Wood Ducks in the Grand Final. Cavaliers secured a second straight BOIDC title, while Kinross were second grade premiers and Orange City took out Centenary Cup competition.

Bathurst club, St Pat's Old Boys won our Bonnor Cup competition to claim their third title in the past 6 years.

We didn't enjoy any success in the Western Premier League competition, losing all 3 of our matches. We didn't enter a team in the Western Zone Cup competition as there was too much uncertainty over whether we had sufficient interest to enter a team. We are working on rercitfiyng that for next season. At the time of writing this report, Western Zone is reviewing the structure of their competitions at Opens level, which could mean that inter-council matches are re-introduced which would cast doubt as to whether their Premier League competition would continue.

We had a number of players selected for higher representative honours this season, with Ed Morrish, Bailey Ferguson, Joey Coughlan, Harry Pearce and Tom Blowes all selected for the Central West Wranglers team which played in the new Western Zone T20 Bash. Morrish, Coughlan, Pearce and Blowes were all selected in the extended Western Zone squad for the Plan B Country Bash and Country Championships held in Orange.

Tom Blowes also played in the Central West Colts team this season, as did Charlie Tink, Max Richards and Matt McKenna. Tom was also part of the NSW Country under 17 side which won the national championships in January.

Jack Brabham wickets on hold for start of Orange cricket season

Cricket season hasn't even started and already there's been a few wickets rules out for the foreseeable future. Jack Brabham 1 and 2 (located on the Huntley Road side) were out of action towards the back-end of the 2022/23 season due to drainage works as part of the ongoing Orange Sports Precinct construction.

Now it has been confirmed those same pitches won't be ready for the beginning of the 2023/24 campaign.

An Orange City Council spokesman said they were making "steady progress" on constructing the eight new sports fields alongside Jack Brabham Park. "While that work continues, there will be some impact for the clubs using the nearby Brabham sports fields," the spokesman added.

"Council is working with the Orange District Cricket Association, Orange District Junior Cricket Association and Orange District Football Association to deliver the sports grounds they'll need for the upcoming summer season."

Although details about locations for games are still being worked on, the council assured athletes the number of grounds available for the summer sports season would "continue to match the needs of the clubs for games." "Council will aim to have Sir Jack Brabham Park 1 and 2 cricket grounds (one to four football fields) available for play later in the season," the spokesman added.

While no replacement wickets have been confirmed, the Central Western Daily has been made aware that work on the turf pitch on Glenroi Oval has been ongoing, possibly in preparation for the upcoming season.

The wicket at Jack Brabham 4 will be available to use from the start of the season, along with Wade Park, Riawena Oval, Country Club Oval and the turf pitches at Kinross Wolaroi School.

The ODCA revealed there would be just five second grade teams - down from seven in 2022/23 - during the upcoming campaign.

When the Bathurst and Orange Inter District Cricket competition draw is taken into account, it means there should be just three weeks throughout the season where second grade games may have to be played on synthetic, dependent on the schedule and availability of Kinross' grounds which are not council operated.

Those dates include November 25, December 2 and December 16 where variations of Wade Park and Riawena are out of action due to representative games.

For the first grade competition, this means the two-day match between CYMS and Bathurst City in round five could be moved to Jack Brabham 4, if Jack Brabham 2 was still not ready. The same would go for the round seven game between Orange City and Bathurst City.

"An important factor is that first grade cricket is the only competition that must play on turf wickets so even if there were insufficient turf wickets, the lower grade competitions can still proceed on our synthetic wicket grounds - this is what occurs when turf wickets are washed out," the council spokesman added.

In terms of summer football, due to the drainage works, there has been less fields available for the sport this past winter. "The fields that were used now need more time for the turf to recover and maintenance," the spokesman said. "Council staff are discussing options with Orange Football about their summer competition and will provide an alternative venue for them to use."

Although no draw has been released yet, there will be six third grade cricket teams and five Centenary Cup sides to go along with the five in second grade.

Mitchell Starc's Manly to play Western Suburbs in Sydney premier cricket match at Wade Park

Mitchell Starc is unlikely to be in the starting line-up but cricket fans will still get the chance to watch one of the best club sides in Australia strut their stuff at Wade Park.

Manly Warringah will face Western Suburbs in Orange after taking their round four Belvidere Cup first grade match on the road. The one-day game will be held at 2.30pm on December 16 and be played under lights while the club has tentative plans to run clinics in the morning.

Manly vice-president David Gainsford, who hails from Narromine, said the idea of bringing a game to the country sprung into his mind when he visited Wade Park in 2022. "I've always been interested in country cricket and I was out at Wade Park last year with my son who was playing for Riverina," he said.



"Basically I was just sitting in the grandstand and chatting to people and thought we should be doing something here to try and take cricket back out to the bush. "That's how it all came about, I was sitting there thinking about what Manly cricket could do to help.

We've got three Orange boys at our club as well with Lachlan and Josh Coyte and George Cumming. "Growing up I always knew Wade Park was a good facility but being there that day and seeing the new indoor facility [was impressive]."

The Waratahs boast an impressive line-up including test bowler Mitchell Starc as well as Jackson Bird, Oli and Joel Davies, Jack Edwards and Ryan Hadley. Those players are unlikely to make the trip however due to the Big Bash League being run at the same time.

Gainsford said the December time slot worked well despite the missing players and said the club would still be able to trot out a formidable line-up. "It was a matter of timing," he said. "You can try to do it earlier in the year but the ground probably wasn't going to be at its best.

"So when we looked at the draw the best time to do it was probably before Christmas, the ground will be in good condition but it will make it harder to bring out all our best players. "Our number one player is Mitchell Starc, you also have Jackson Bird, Oli and Joel Davies, Jack Edwards and Ryan Hadley. They are all contracted to Big Bash League clubs so we obviously can't guarantee they will be there.

"But we had great success last year with four teams in the grand final and winning the club championship so there are plenty of players ready to take their opportunities."

Centrals Cricket Club pull out of BOIDC mid-way through 2023-24 season

Centrals have pulled the pin on their Bathurst and Orange Inter District Cricket campaign midway through the season. The club's first grade side had not tasted victory in the competition since March 5, 2022 - a total of 16 completed games spanning across three different seasons.

BOIDC and Orange District Cricket Association president Mark Frecklington was informed of the news on Sunday, a day after Centrals' five wicket loss to Bathurst City.

First grade captain Adam Shepherd indicated a lack of interest in the two-day format was a factor in the decision and that the club was dealing with the matter internally. Frecklington confirmed the red and blacks would be dropping back down to second grade, rather than folding the team altogether.

This means there will now be a bye in the BOIDC competition, and the rules will be the same as when Centennials Bulls pulled out mid-way through the 2022-23 season.

The ODCA second grade competition, which previously had five sides, will no longer have a bye. It is expected Centrals will take on Wanderers on November 25, barring any wet weather. What is yet to be determined is how many points Centrals - who were second last with four points in the BOIDC - would have when they entered the second grade competition.

"I've not been in this situation ever," Frecklington said. "So the committee is going to take a bit of time to think about it and have a chat and work out how that works. There's been no discussion yet about how that will work."

The president added one issue they now faced was not all second grade teams had the same number of byes after seven rounds. "It's just negotiating what the right outcome is and I don't know what the answer to that is just yet," Frecklington added.

This marks the third successive season where at least one club has either pulled out of the BOIDC during or just prior to the season, following Kinross' exit ahead of the 2021-22 campaign and ORC prior to the current season.

With just seven teams left to compete, Frecklington was asked if he feared for the future of the BOIDC.

"It's not ideal," he said. "I think everyone else is okay, I certainly don't think it's under threat and I think we do need that competition. Without it, both towns would have weaker first grade competitions.

"It's just about trying to make a good standard of first grade cricket. I don't see it disappearing in the near future."



Coyte relishes 'bloody special' Manly debut in front of home crowd

Lachlan Coyte grew up around Wade Park, running around with friends while his brother played. Eventually he had the chance to play on the hallowed turf himself, excelling as a representative batsman.

On Saturday (December 16) his career came full circle, making his first grade Sydney Premier Cricket debut for Manly Warringah at none other than Wade Park.



The one-day match against Western Suburbs was the first in a bid to bring more premier cricket to the bush and it just so happened Coyte finally received the call-up after three seasons with the club. Safe to say he is still on cloud nine.

"To make it at home is pretty bloody special in terms of it being the first ever game of premier cricket to be taken out of Sydney," he said. "My goal was obviously to play first grade ever since going down to Sydney, that's what I've wanted to do.

"I always remember when I was a 10 year old kid just running around the outside of Wade Park and playing cricket with my mates while watching Bonnor Cup or whatever game was playing and watching my brother play."

Hard work pays off

Some strong performances in second grade meant Coyte had caught the eye of the coaching staff.

He initially missed the phone call informing him of his selection however. "So I found out on Wednesday, [assistant coach] Jay Lenton called me," he said. "I actually missed his call. I had the day off and my housemate ran my phone into me and he said 'answer this phone call right now', he chucked me the phone and then I actually missed the call and then had to call him back."

Manly were ultimately upset by Wests, being bowled out for 232 in pursuit of 244.

Coyte made four runs but the experience had only made him hungrier to lock down a place in a star-studded roster featuring the likes of Mitchell Starc, Jackson Bird, Oli and Joel Davies, Jack Edwards and Ryan Hadley.

Brien brothers break Cavaliers' hearts in Bonnor Cup rout

It turns out that the Brien brothers' big performance in the Bonnor Cup semi-final was just an entree ahead of an even more satisfying main course.

Cooper and Bailey Brien steered St Pat's Old Boys to a Bonnor Cup title in Friday night's grand final against Cavaliers, putting on 78 and 58 respectively in a match-winning century stand. Their efforts took the Saints to an imposing total of 7-172 in the Twenty20 decider and Cavaliers could only muster up 95 in response at Wade Park.

It comes just a fortnight after the Brien siblings put on 70 runs together in their semi-final success against Rugby Union.

The win marks St Pat's Old Boys as one of the most dominant Twenty20 clubs in the region, adding to their Bonnor Cup titles they won in 2019 and 2022.

Saints captain Adam Ryan said it was a treat to watch the Brien boys once again doing what they do best. "They both played their role extremely well, with Cooper being the aggressor and Bailey keeping it at a run a ball and rotating strike. You can't ask for a better start before going out to field," he said. "Some of that hitting from Cooper was the cleanest I've seen. Usually you'd see some nerves come into your game in finals but there was none of that from him."

Pat's won the toss and elected to bat. The early loss of Nic Broes brought Bailey Brien to the crease alongside his brother with the score at 1-5, and they quickly fell into a familiar pattern of play together. Bailey began to play at close to a run a ball while Cooper began pummelling boundaries at the other end.

Cooper would amass his score off just 41 balls, hitting seven fours and four sixes along the way. He eventual fell to the bowling of Tom Blowes to make it 2-109 but his brother continued to hang around until the very last delivery of the innings, where he was run out. Cooper had hit Blowes for a pair of boundaries in the two balls leading up to the dismissal and earlier in the innings he hit him for a six, four and four in consecutive balls.

Cavs were able to take a couple of quick wickets before a quick cameo from Connor Slattery (12) helped set a strong total.

It was a shaky start for Cavaliers when they lost captain Bailey Ferguson (3) early on. A run-a-ball 20 from Tom Carruthers and a quick fire 15 from Rory Kalnins kept Cavaliers on pace early but no-one could go on with their starts. Hugh Middleton's (15) promising start was ended by Hugh Parsons, then Wesley Lummis' (10) dismissal made it 6-68 and left Cavaliers with too much to do.

Broes might have come up short with the bat, but he was in fine form with the ball, leading the way with his figures of 3-20.

Ryan has overseen all three of the Saints' Bonnor Cup wins, along with a recent Bathurst District Cricket Association first grade crown. "I'm pretty proud of this one, especially the fact that our marquees were our juniors who had gone away to play cricket and then come back to play in this one," he said. "A lot of these guys have come through Presidents Cup right through to first grade, so that's the really pleasing thing about this win from a club point of view.

"I don't know why we seem to do this sometimes, but we sometimes play a hard game in the semi then hit our straps in the final. It feels so good to get the win."

SECOND GRADE

Six teams contested the Second Grade competition with both Gladstone and Spring Hill moving down to Third Grade for this season. The season started with 5 teams until Centrals pulled out of First Grade in November. Centrals were given points for the rounds they missed, which included 4 points for the washed out round and 2 points for every other round.



Kinross feeling 'relieved' while third grade decider lasts less than two hours

The Kinross Wolaroi School first XI has more premierships in them according to player-coach Walter Prowse.

Prowse said with the bulk of the team not yet in Year 12, Kinross would set their sights on going back-to-back in 2024/25. "I think yesterday Fletcher Byrne played really well with the bat, he really took the game away from them," he said.

"Liam McKenzie has really stepped up as a quality fast bowler at the top of the order for us and Will Younghusband had a great day with the ball yesterday. "He's looking like a really exciting prospect for us.

"Charlie Miller I think is coming along in leaps and bounds lately, I think he's been a big part of the team, especially towards the second half of the season. "So we've got some good talent, still to come for the years, for the next couple of years."

In third grade the decider lasted less than two hours as Spring Hill was bowled out for just 28 against Orange CYMS. Central Western Daily reporter Riley Krause led the way with an astonishing 6-3 off 3.4 overs.
